

Hong Kong – MBS 50th Anniversary Prominent Alumni Series: China 2014 economics review and 2015 outlook

The annual meeting of the National People's Congress (NPC) was successfully completed on 15 March. The government lowered its official growth target for 2015 to "about 7%" from "about 7.5%" for last year. This marks the lowest target in the past 16 years.

Coincidentally, USD index reached the 12 years high in March 2015 while RMB to USD exchange rate entered its downward trend after its historical high at 29th October 2014.

What messages these indicators bring to us and how should we position ourselves in the process of China's economic and financial reform by tolerate a relatively lower short-term growth in order to achieve sustainable long-term growth.
